**Lesson Plans for Younger Children**

**Scripture: Matthew 10:40-42**

In this season after Pentecost, we hear stories of Jesus ministry in the world and our call to engage in that mission. This season is also known as Ordinary Time coming from the word “ordinal” which means counted time. This time is not ordinary as in common or regular, but it is the time of counted weeks between Pentecost and Advent. The color for this season is green and it is often referred to as the green growing time as we hear stories of what God is calling us to do in the world, we join in that call, and we grow in our faith.

**A Notation for This Week’s Gospel and Reading**

Whoever welcomes you, welcomes Christ. Whoever welcomes Christ, welcomes God. Seems simple, but it is rather profound if you stop to think about it. As these words were being written, there weren’t phones or computers or even the postal service. Welcoming someone who came bearing a message meant welcoming not just the messenger, but also the one who sent the message. God sent Christ as a messenger, as one who came to show us and speak to us about God and living as people of God. For us today, what does welcoming the other look like and how do we welcome Christ into our lives? Who or what are our messengers today?

**Theme: Welcoming Christ**

**Before:** For the beginning exercise, you will need small plastic cups and water. For the activity, you will need plastic cups (reusable ones like the tumblers you can find at the dollar store), permanent markers, and stickers.

**Beginning:** Invite the children to gather and give each of them a small cup of water to drink, welcoming them to the space. You can ask them what things we might do to welcome someone into our home or into our classroom.

**Opening Prayer:** Loving God, we ask you to be with us as we explore what your words mean for our lives. Guide us as we seek to welcome and be welcomed. Amen.

**The Story: Matthew 10:40-42**

Today, we hear Jesus telling the disciples about the work that they are going to do for Christ. He tells them, “We are closely connected in this work. Anyone who welcomes what you do, welcomes me because I sent you. Anyone who welcomes me, also welcomes God. By welcoming one another, we are helping one another and helping with God’s work. There is a lot of work to do, but we do not need to worry about that because there are many of us to do it. As you welcome the someone doing God’s work, start small. Give a cool cup of water to someone who is thirsty, for instance. The smallest act of giving or receiving makes you a student and learner of God’s work.”

**Questions:**

- I wonder what work God has given us?
- I wonder how we welcome people as if we were welcoming God?
- I wonder how giving someone a cup of water is helping God's messengers?

**Activity: Welcoming Cup**

In today's lesson, Jesus instructed that we are to give someone who is thirsty a cool cup of water. Today, we are going to make our own welcoming cups that we can use at home.

Invite the children to each take a cup and decorate it with markers or stickers.

**Getting Closure:** Invite the children to put away their supplies and clean up with your help. Gather them in a circle and ask them to share what they created.

**Closing Prayer:** Loving God, help us welcome one another and to welcome you. Help us to hear and see your messengers in our midst. Guide our ears, eyes, mouth, hands, and feet that we may engage in your mission in the world. Amen.

**Lesson Plans for Older Children**

**Scripture: Matthew 10:40-42**

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**Theme: Welcoming Christ**

**Before Class:** You will need Bibles or copies of the scripture for each child. For the Beginning activity, you will need small cups filled with water for each child. For the Activities you will need: plain paper, construction paper, markers, art supplies, reusable plastic tumblers (like the ones that can be found at the dollar store) and permanent markers.

**Beginning:** Gather the children together and give them a small cup of water to drink. As they are enjoying the water, ask them if they remember a time they were welcomed as a new person into a group of people. What does it mean to be welcoming?

**Opening Prayer:** Loving God, we ask you to be with us as we explore what your words mean for our lives. Guide us as we seek to welcome and be welcomed. Amen.

**The Story: Matthew 10:40-42** Invite someone to read the lesson for today. If you have time, you can read it from two different translations and note how they are different.

**Questions:**

- I wonder what it means to welcome someone?
- I wonder what it feels like to be welcomed?
- What do you think Jesus meant when he said, “Whoever welcomes you, welcomes me?”
- I wonder why giving a cold cup of water would be meaningful to someone whom you are welcoming?
- I wonder how we would welcome Christ if we knew he was coming?

**Activity:**

Invite the children to talk about what welcoming practices they know about or have experienced. (such as a cup of water when thirsty, food when hungry, welcome signs, people greeting you at a door when you arrive, inviting someone to play a game when they are being left out, etc.)

Invite them to create welcoming practices for their home and church. Help them figure out what welcoming practices they want to create by asking them questions like:

- What does welcoming the other look like?
- How do we welcome Christ into our lives?
- Who or what are our messengers today?

**Possible Ideas:**

- Welcome Poster: paper, markers and art supplies
- Welcome cup: Have plain plastic cups and permanent markers ready if they want to create a cup in which they would give someone a cup of cold water when they enter the house or classroom
- Welcome Sign: Have construction paper and art supplies ready if they want to create a sign for the door.

**Getting Closure:** Invite the children to share what they created. Invite them to share how they think they might live into this vision today.

**Closing Prayer:** Loving God, help us welcome one another and to welcome you. Help us to hear and see your messengers in our midst. Guide our ears, eyes, mouth, hands, and feet that we may engage in your mission in the world. Amen.

**Gospel Lesson for Adults**

**Scripture: Matthew 10:40-42**

**A Notation for This Week’s Gospel and Reading**

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**Theme: Welcoming Christ**

**Before Class:** You will need two different translations of today’s reading. You can either supply enough Bibles (of both translations) or make copies of the scripture for each person.

**Beginning:** As people are arriving, you may want to give them a small cup of water as a way of illustrating our Gospel lesson. Invite everyone to gather and ask them what it means for someone to be welcoming. After a brief discussion, open in prayer.

**Opening Prayer:** Loving God, we ask you to be with us as we explore what your words mean for our lives. Guide us as we seek to welcome and be welcomed. Amen.

**The Scripture: Matthew 10:40-42**

You will be reading the lesson today twice and will need two different readers. Think about having two very different voices read this such as male or female, young or old. Before reading the lesson the first time, invite people to listen for a word or phrase that stood out for them.

Invite the first reader to read the lesson.

After a few moments of silence, invite the group to say what word or phrase stood out for them.

When you feel everyone has shared, invite the group to listen once more and to listen for what Jesus is saying to them. Invite the second reader to read the lesson.

After a few moments of silence, invite the group to say what they heard Jesus saying to them.

After everyone has shared, you can begin with the questions or go to the activity.

**Questions:**

- I wonder what this Gospel stirs in us?
- I wonder why giving a cold cup of water would be meaningful to someone whom you are welcoming?
- What does it say about how we welcome people here at church?
- What does it tell us about how we welcome the stranger?
- What does it say to us if we are the ones being welcomed?

**Activity Option:** Invite the group to discuss how your faith community welcomes people on Sundays as well as other days of the week. You can do this in smaller groups or in a large group. How is this Gospel lesson inviting us to change how we greet and welcome people? Do we really welcome them as if they were Christ?

**Getting Closure:** Invite them to share what stood out for them in our discussion today. How might the world be different if we welcomed each person as if they were truly Christ?

**Closing Prayer:** Loving God, help us welcome one another and to welcome you. Help us to hear and see your messengers in our midst. Guide our ears, eyes, mouth, hands, and feet that we may engage in your mission in the world. Amen.
